

## Video Lecture Notes and Reflections

*1 Fluency Point (FP) Each*

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### Description:

While you're watching a YouTube lecture video for an upcoming live class, take notes on a paper-based notebook or tablet (just like pre-COVID – remember that?). Save your notes as PDF, JPG or PNG, and submit on Gradescope before the start of the next live class (12pm on Mon, Wed or Fri).

### Deliverable:

A PDF, JPG or PNG file containing your notes.

### Content Rules:

- Your notes must show strong evidence of thoughtfulness and details
- Your notes should also contain a written reflection of what you've just learned, and questions or any confusion that may have occurred in your mind

### Formatting Rules:

- You must sign and date at the bottom of each page of your notes
- If you have more than one page (or more than one file), you must also put a page number at the bottom of each page
- There's no requirement of minimum or maximum number of pages
- If your notes are hand written, they must be legible
- Your digitized notes must be of sufficient resolution and quality
- Your digitized notes must be in the “vertical flow” orientation, i.e., not requiring the reader (Dr. Siow or the TA) to rotate their head
- Your notes must be based on the lecture video for the next live class – see course homepage's “Calendar Central” for which notes # goes with which video

### Submission:

Submit a PDF, or any number of JPG/PNG, on Gradescope. Submissions by email or other means will be disregarded.

Due at the start of the next live class, i.e., at 12:00 pm CST on each day of live class (Mon, Wed and Fri).

Late submissions will be subject to the “half-life” reduction policy according to the syllabus.
